Holiday Classic Futsal Tournament Rules & Regulations

Rosters

- Each team roster is limited to a maximum of **14 players**.
- Ensure to have a final roster submitted at least two weeks prior to tournament.
- **Parental Signature:** Each parent must sign on the same row as their player on the roster.
- **Player Eligibility:**
 - Players cannot appear on more than one roster in the same age group, unless they are listed as “keeper only” on the second roster.

Equipment

- **Mandatory Gear:** All players must wear shin guards and flat, non-marking shoes.
- **Uniform Requirements:**
 - Players should wear uniforms of the same color.
 - Teams must have an alternate shirt or pinnie available.
 - Goalkeepers must wear a jersey that is a different color from both their team and their opponent.

Substitutions

- **General Substitutions:**
 - Substitutions are unlimited and can be made on the fly from the bench area.
 - Players exiting the field must be near the bench and must not interfere with play during the switch.
 - **Penalty for Violations:**
 - If too many players are on the field, the opposing team receives an indirect free kick.
 - A second infraction during the same game results in a yellow card for the offending player.
- **Goalkeeper Substitutions:**

- Must occur during a stoppage of play and require the referee's permission.

Game Play

20 Minutes fast paced games

Age Group and Team Composition

U11 - U14

- Team Size: 5 players per team
 - On Court: 4 players
 - Goalkeeper: 1 player

U8 - U10

- Team Size: 6 players per team
 - On Court: 5 players
 - Goalkeeper: 1 player

Ball Specifications

- U8 - U12: Use a Size 3 futsal ball
- U12 - U14: Use a Size 4 futsal ball

Kick-off:

- Used to begin the game or restart after a goal.
- The ball may go in any direction but cannot be a direct kick on goal.

Ball In and Out of Play:

- All play-ins from out of bounds are kick-ins.
- Teams have 5 seconds to play the ball in unless play has been stopped by the referee.
- The ball is considered out of play if it:
 - Crosses the out of bounds sidelines, clearly marked on the court, resulting in an indirect kick near where it went out.
 - Strikes the ceiling or basketball hoop, resulting in an indirect free kick from the nearest point.
 - Lands on top of the goal or behind the goal net, put back into play with a goalie ball.
 - Becomes unplayable at the referee's discretion, resulting in a drop ball or indirect free kick.

Offside Rule

- The offside law will **not** be enforced during the tournament.
